

Injured Spouse Instructions

This information applies only to taxes intercepted by the Office of State Debt Collection (OSDC)

If you are married, filed a joint return, and you had your state tax refund taken by the OSDC for a debt that your spouse individually owes, you may claim your part of a state tax refund if **BOTH** of the following apply:

1. **You received and reported income, such as wages, taxable interest, etc., on the joint return; and**
2. **You had Utah income tax withheld from your wages.**

The OSDC requires the following information from you to apply for injured spouse relief. If **BOTH** of the above conditions apply and you want your share of the overpayment shown on the joint return refunded, you should:

- Provide your Income and Utah Withholding information in the table below (**amounts must tie to your tax returns**)

- attach a copy of your marriage license
- attach copies of your complete federal and state tax income tax returns
- attach copies of W-2, 1099 and other forms showing all Utah withholding amounts
- include a copy of the letter from OSDC that informed you that your tax refund was intercepted
